Violent Crime Bill Advances

The Visitor Public Safety Conference, the Waikīkī Improvement Association, the Waikīkī Neighborhood Board and the City and County of Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney Steve Alm, all support Senate Bill 2347. This bill allows the prosecutor to charge a person who has been convicted of 3 or more violent misdemeanors (within 5 years) with a class C felony.

The bill targets persistent habitual violent offenders who have the following violent misdemeanors convictions: (a) Assault in the third degree under section 707-712; (b) Assault against a law enforcement officer in the second degree under section 707-712.6; or (c) Sexual assault in the fourth degree under section 707-733. Allowing prosecutors to charge repeat violent offenders with a class C felony will take them off the streets. This bill will protect law enforcement and the public from perpetrators of multiple violent attacks.

WIA President Rick Egged testified, “Some individuals commit multiple violent attacks on others. If none of the attacks cause sufficient harm to rise to the level of a felony, the perpetrator is only charged with a misdemeanor and escapes serious punishment. For example, a victim can be pushed, punched, kicked and the crime remains a misdemeanor. Those that repeatedly commit such violent acts need to be held accountable.”

Waikīkī resident John Deutzman proposed this concept at the December 6, 2023 Visitor Public Safety Conference, chaired and convened by Hawaii Lodging and Tourism Association President Mufi Hannemann. State Senator Sharon Moriwaki introduced the Bill in the legislature.

The Bill passed the State Senate with 25 aye votes on February 29, 2024. The State House Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs held a hearing on March 28th and recommended it to the full State House of Representatives to pass the measure.

Safe & Sound Waikiki

Safe & Sound Waikiki continues to make strides in increasing public safety efforts while expanding capacity for outreach, mental health, and case management within the Waikiki district. HPD recently certified 21 police officers for specialized bike patrol in the Waikiki and Chinatown areas, adding additional visibility and the capability to patrol in areas normal patrol cars may not be able to. In March 2024, HPD also partnered with Safe & Sound Waikiki and the Hawaii Bicycling League to host "Light Up the Night", a bike safety event where families, children, and bike enthusiasts alike could take a group ride around Kapiolani Park while promoting healthy lifestyles and trusted relationships with local law enforcement.

The WBID's partnership with IHS has also resulted in a full-time case coordinator, Tati Young, who focuses primarily on street outreach and connecting individuals in need of outreach services to comprehensive case management and support from the IHS network. To date, over 150 individuals have been worked with, and 16 individuals have been placed into housing.

Additionally, the team's street-based medicine efforts continue to expand. Dave Fields, APRN-Rx, has joined the team part-time to aid in the administering of medication for those with clinically diagnosed mental health conditions within the district. Students who are currently gaining clinical hours under him also join in for outreach and provide added capacity for street medicine efforts.

In February 2024, Safe & Sound Waikiki and the WBID successfully petitioned it's first Assisted Community Treatment court order, mandating a regimen of critically needed mental health medication for an individual in the Waikiki district who was cycling in and out of the criminal justice system while suffering from substance abuse and homelessness. Since receiving medication, we are proud to share that this individual is on the road to recovery, has regained mental clarity and cognition, and is eager to work with case managers to obtain housing, employment, and to reconnect with their family.

We look forward to continued efforts to support the Waikiki community and ensure its safety for those live in, work in, and visit our district.

Waikīkī Transportation Management Special Improvement District

Kalia Road Repair and Reconstruction Project

On Wednesday, March 20, 2024, the Waikiki Transportation Management Association (WTMA) organized a coordination meeting to discuss the repair and reconstruction of Kalia Road and sidewalks. The project site is between Paoa Place by the Hilton Hawaiian Village and Saratoga Road. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is the project lead.

The project will be conducted in three phases. Two of the phases (Phases 1 and 3) will maintain full access in all directions. The recommendation is for a course of action that includes full road closure for 30 days during Phase 2. The entire expected duration of the project is 162 calendar days or almost six months assuming no complications. Construction is expected to begin in January 2025.

Three other options were presented to offer different approaches to a full road closure but were judged to be not as preferable as the recommended course of action.



Concerns raised include:

- Managing detours of larger vehicles such as buses and freight vehicles. Plans for where to turn vehicles around need to be developed.
- Avoiding conflicts with events on Kalakaua Avenue including legacy parades.
- Managing and adjusting intersection signal timing needs to be considered.
- Outreach to adjacent and nearby hotels and businesses and those who routinely use the road needs to be done.
- Avoiding overlap with other roadway projects such as Kalakaua Avenue repaving, Board of Water Supply Projects, and Kuhio Avenue Bus Lane installation.
- Identifying how passenger and freight carriers can temporarily serve their customers at the Hilton, Hale Koa, and adjacent locations.
- Working with Hawaii Department of Transportation for temporary bus stops on Ala Moana Boulevard for passenger carriers.

The conclusion was that this project is essential and must be done. It will be a “huge mess” is an appropriate sentiment that was expressed. The best way to mitigate issues is to provide ample communication. The Army asked all participants to coordinate through the WTMA. It was recommended that ongoing communications be maintained so project impacts and news can be quickly identified, discussed, and information disseminated.

Participants included representatives from the Army, Chair Tommy Waters office, City Department of Transportation Services, Honolulu Police Department, TheBus, Hale Koa, and the Hawaii Department of Transportation. Waikiki was well represented by WTMA members, WIA, WBID, and WNB.

20th Annual Waikiki SPAM JAM[®] Festival Returns to Waikiki Saturday, April 27

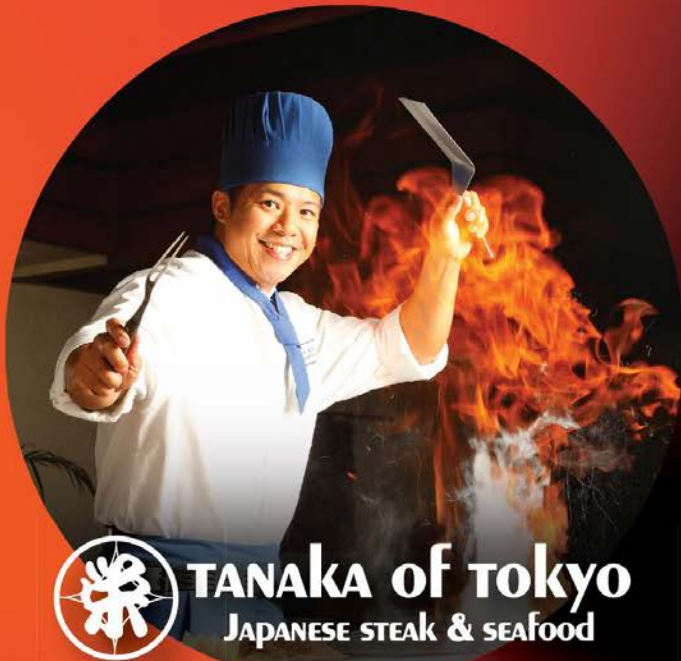

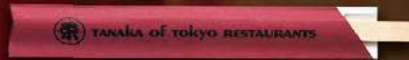
