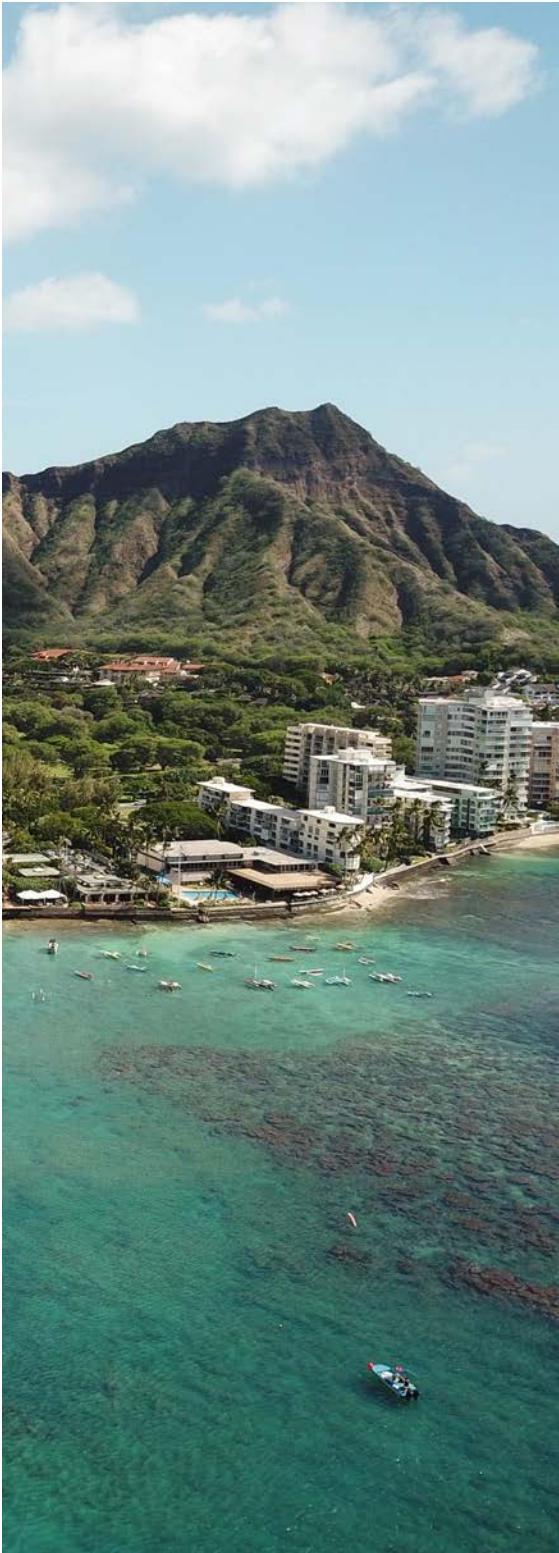

WAIKĪKĪ BEACH NEWS AND UPDATES: Royal Hawaiian Groin Replacement Project Underway, Completion Expected In July

WAIKĪKĪ BEACH SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 5-YEAR ANNIVERSARY

July, 2020 marks the 5-year anniversary for the WBSIDA. While this is a challenging time for everyone, we also want to recognize and acknowledge the accomplishments and achievements completed during this time while making plans for future improvements to the beach areas in Waikīkī. The Spring of 2020 brought the onset of COVID-19 health precautions and travel restrictions with Waikīkī experiencing unprecedented declines in visitor arrivals. The Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District Association (WBSIDA) is reflecting on this economic down-turn as an important time of renewal and rejuvenation of Waikīkī Beach. COVID-19 has no precedent and requires creativity, flexibility and nimbleness in response. So, like the rest of the world, the WBSIDA is adapting to the times. We've had the opportunity to change some of our plans for projects in Waikīkī, having worked to accelerate the reconstruction of the Royal Hawaiian Groin project that is currently underway. We also partnered

with the state to complete the new Kuhio Beach sandbag groin in November, 2019. The WBSIDA has spent the last two years in partnership with the Department of Land and Natural Resources developing a "Master Plan" (Environmental Impact Statement) for Waikīkī Beach that identifies potential beach improvements that will serve us for generations to come. We look forward to major beach improvements as a result of the Master Plan effort and expect some of these projects to come to fruition in 2022.

Three major beach improvement projects are underway with one completed, one underway and another being planning for this winter. The projects include the completion of the Kuhio Sandbag groin at Kuhio Beach. This 110 foot-long sandbag groin was completed in November, 2019 and will serve to stabilize this section of important beach area fronting the Duke Kahanamoku statue. Another project to reconstruct the Royal Hawaiian Groin, is currently underway and roughly half-way through construction with an expected completion in July, 2020. The third project planned for the winter of 2021 focuses on restoring the beach between the Royal Hawaiian and the Moana Surfrider with an additional 12,000 cubic yards of sand from immediately offshore.

- Accelerated construction timeframe due to COVID shutdown.

- \$2.0 million estimated total construction cost of RHG Project.
- \$1.0 million (50% cost share) between the WBSIDA and the DLNR.

Kalākaua Sidewalk Beautification Project



The Waikīkī sidewalk beautification project that started in 2018 stretching along Kalākaua Avenue to Kapahulu Avenue just completed the last phase of construction. There are some deficiencies that need to be corrected before the contractor can turn it over to the City and County.

The project that replaced the red brick with quartzite flagstone and added enhanced and new landscaping with drainage improvements has had its challenges, to say the least, but the finished improvements will enrich the enjoyment and walking experience along Kalakaua Avenue.

It was originally scheduled for completion in 2019, but with the minor corrections everything should be completed within the next two weeks.

The Park Shore Hotel, the Aloha Alohllani Resort Waikiki Beach and Foster Towers were the final sections done to finish the project.

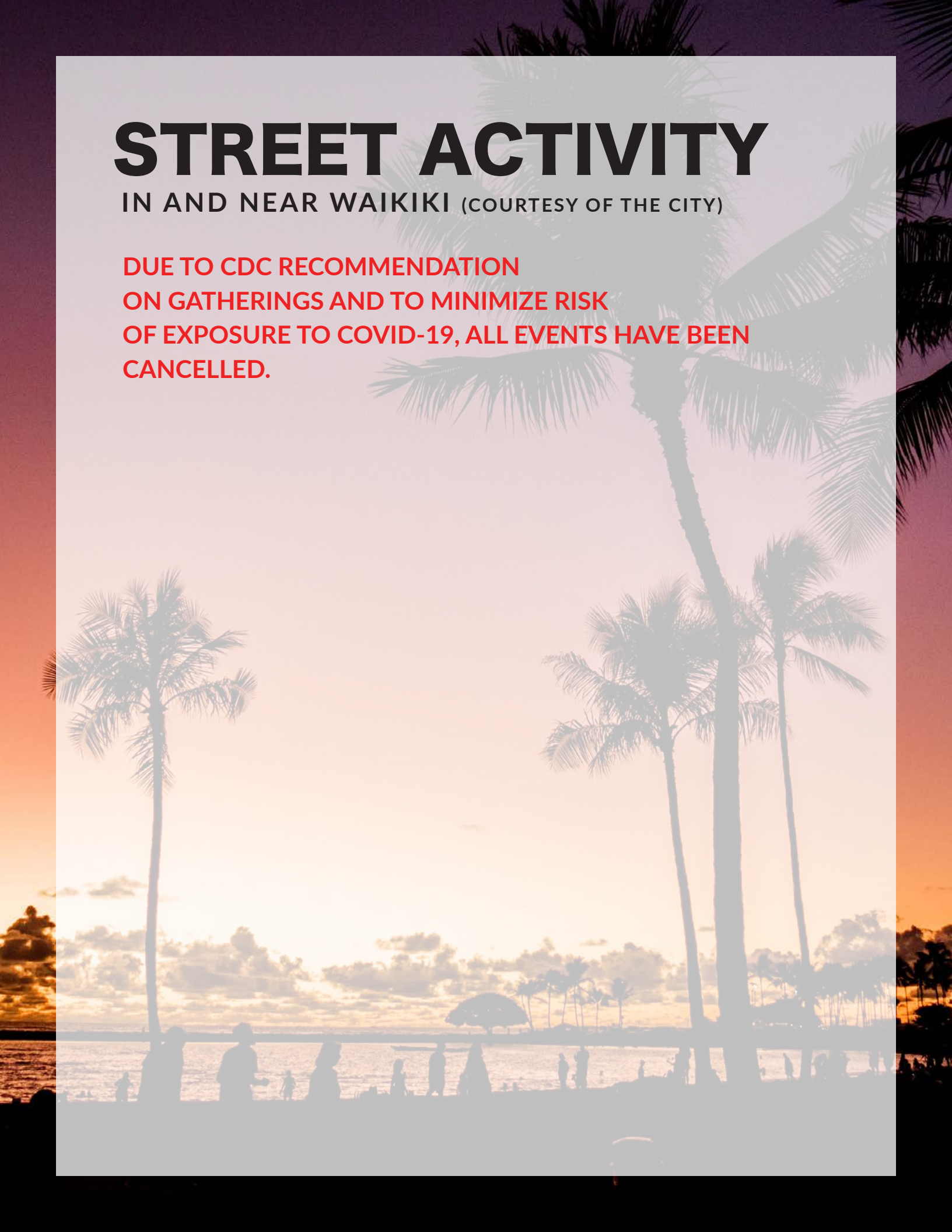

HAWAII CONVENTION CENTER SERVES AS UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS PROCESSING LOCATION



The Hawai'i Convention Center is pleased to open its meetings space for use as a satellite unemployment insurance processing location for the State of Hawai'i, as claims have dramatically increased during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Nearly 1,000 volunteer positions will be staffed by public labor unions and members of the State Legislature to handle the processing of claims at the Center, in addition to ongoing claims processing at the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations. Computers were sourced from State offices across O'ahu.

Several hundred work stations were set up during the week of April 20, 2020, in the Center's Ballroom space, as well as seven other meeting rooms.

To ensure the health and safety of volunteers and staff, social distancing and personal protective equipment (PPE) guidelines are being followed, and Hawai'i National Guard service members are conducting security and temperature checks.

The Hawai'i Convention Center claims processing center is not open to the public.

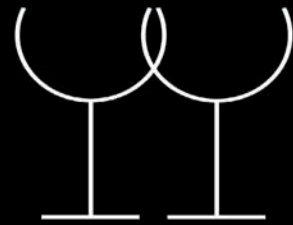

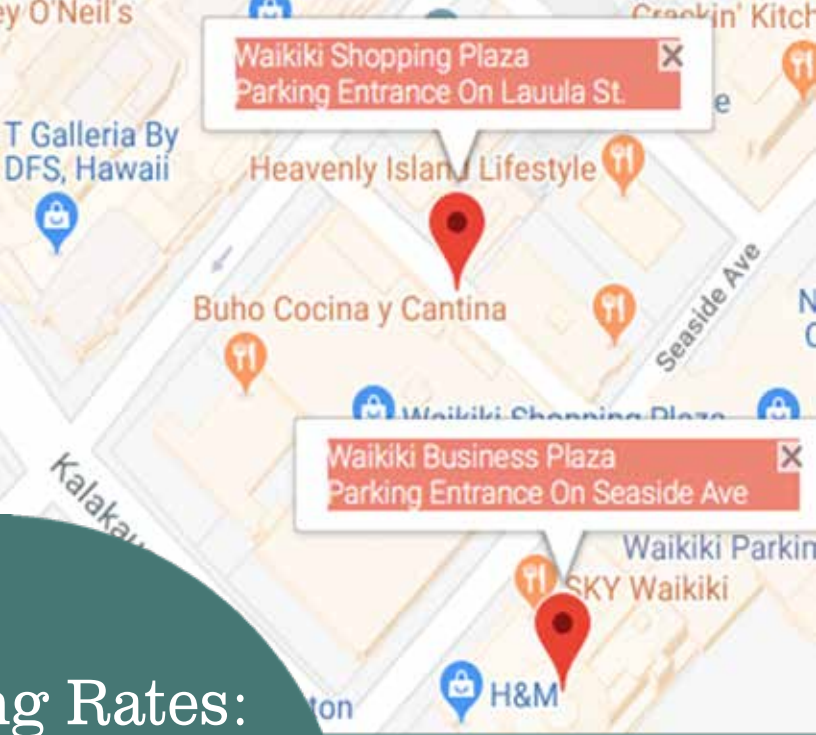
