Bill 41 Short-Term Vacation Rentals, Heads To Full City Council

The third reading of Bill 41 passed out of the Zoning and Planning Committee on March 23, 2022 and will go to full council mid-April. This bill addresses community complaints of parking, noise and crowding connected to vacation rentals in non-resort communities across Oahu.

The proposed amendments in Bill 41 apply stricter limits of where transient vacation units may exist than the ordinance passed in 2019.

The latest version of the bill bans on-street parking for visitors renting transient vacation units and bed & breakfasts in areas zoned as country, residential or apartment use. The amended version of Bill 41 keeps intact the proposal to increase the minimum stay from 30 days to 90 days for short-term rentals without a nonconforming use certificate.

HAWAII'S HALF-MARATHON

Returns to Waikiki

After a two year break, The Hapalua - Hawaii's Half Marathon, is back in Waikiki on April 10, 2022!

Around 6500 participants are expected at the comeback event, 15% of whom are visitors to Hawaii.

The Hapalua is the largest half marathon in Hawaii and has been an annual Waikiki event since 2012. The Hapalua is organized by the Honolulu Marathon Association.

The beautiful start is right by the Duke Kahanamoku statue. The main field will go off at 6am on Sunday, April 10th. The course goes out toward downtown before coming back on Kalakaua Avenue, up and around Diamond Head, and finishing in Kapiolani Park.





All finishers earn a medal and a race shirt, as well as the delicious malasadas and cold pressed pineapple juice at the festival finisher area. The main stage in the festival area will have live music and friends and family are welcome to join in the fun.

Being fully inclusive, there are no qualifications to enter the Hapalua and there is no time limit. Walkers and runners are equally welcome.

The elite field, headed this year by Ed Cheserk, will finish in around one hour and the final finisher usually takes around 5 hours to complete the 13.1mile course.

Although online registration ended on March 31st, walk-in registrations are welcomed at the Hapalua Expo, which is held at the Hawaii Convention Center.

Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort Presents their new A'o Cultural Center and Herb Kāne Lounge

As part of its \$80 million transformation, Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort now welcomes guests to its brand new A'o Cultural Center and Herb Kāne Lounge.

"We've always sought to let Hawai'i's host culture be the steward of the guest experience at Outrigger Reef and we're happy to strengthen this commitment even further through the new A'o Cultural Center and Herb Kāne Lounge," said Markus Krebs, general manager of Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort.

"The A'o Cultural Center exhibits will bring the genius of Polynesian wayfinding to life for kama'aina and malihini visitors to the

Outrigger. It is part of Outrigger's stalwart support of Polynesian Voyaging Society (PVS) and our mission," said PVS CEO and navigator Nainoa Thompson. "On March 8, 1975 Hawai'i's first voyaging canoe in 600 years, Hōkūle'a, launched into the waters of Kualoa, O'ahu, realizing a quiet dream long-held by our co-founder Herb Kawainui Kāne. And so selecting this date to mark the rebirth of the Herb Kāne Lounge and A'o Cultural Center at Outrigger Reef is a fitting tribute to Hawai'i's rich voyaging past and its bright future."





The renewed center will be anchored by a virtual exhibit designed by digital artist Kari Kēhau Noe picturing the legendary sailing canoe Hōkūle'a using pieces of the actual sail 32A that was used on the Mālama Honua Worldwide Voyage.

The center will also serve as the hub for guests to engage in a spectrum of Hawaiian cultural activities. Led by 20-year veteran cultural director Luana Maitland, guests will be able to glean from her vast knowledge of the arts of Hawai'i and participate in hula lessons; try their hand at Hawai'i's official instrument, the 'ukulele; make a lei or kukui nut kupe'e bracelet and much more.

The legacy of the late artist, historian and founding member of PVS Herb Kawainui Kāne has been featured throughout the resort for decades and has now taken on new life in the renovated Herb Kāne Lounge, featuring earthy textures and an updated, modern design. The lounge includes four original paintings from Kāne and faces an expansive mural of a traditional sailing canoe that runs the length of the check-in desk.

The first phase of Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort's \$80 million transformation was completed in April 2021 and included renovated guestrooms and the reimagined Kani Ka Pila Grille. The second phase of the property, including the Diamond Head Tower, Waiola Wellness Wing and Coral Kids Club is slated to be complete by fall 2022. The anchor restaurant, Monkeypod Kitchen by Merriman, is expected to open by the end of 2022.

Special traffic control will be in effect in Downtown, Kakaako, Ala Moana, Waikiki, Diamond Head, Kahala, Aina Haina, Niu Valley, and East Honolulu areas for the Hapalua Hawaii's Half-Marathon on Sunday, April 10, 2022.

Beginning at 12:30AM, one or more lanes will be closed and/or coned until the athletes complete that section of the course. Roadways will be progressively opened as the athletes clear each area. Tow-Away zones are in effect from **Midnight until 5:00PM** Sunday.

The Hapalua Start is 6:00AM.



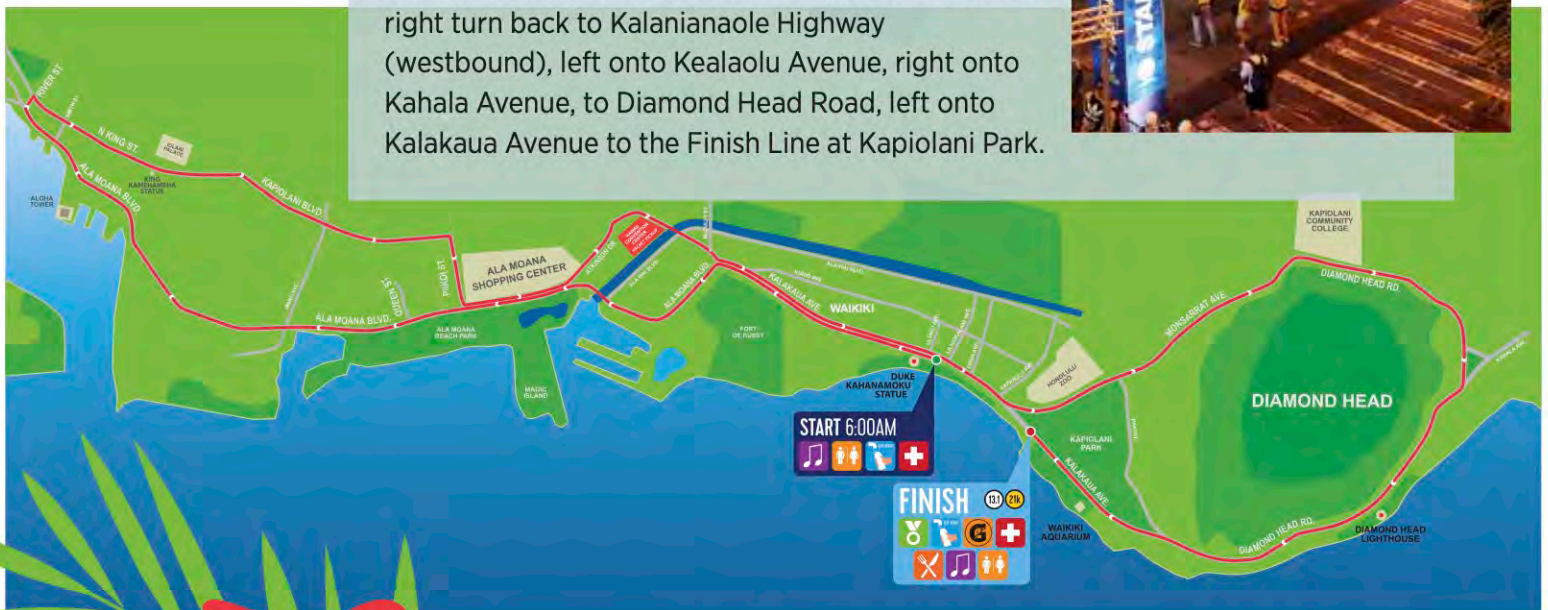
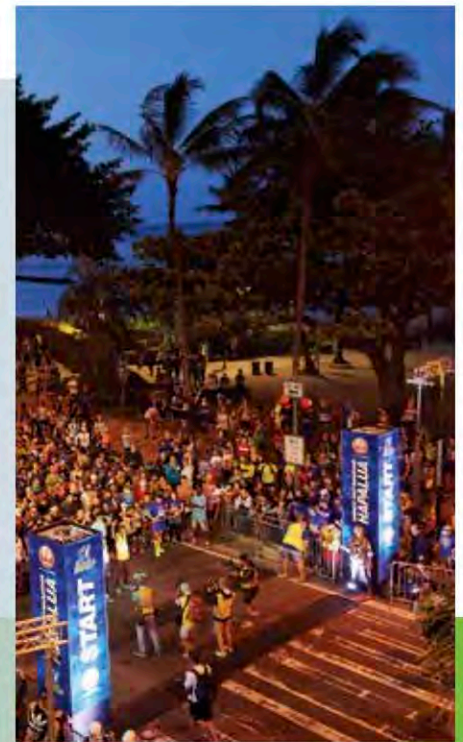

HAPALUA ROUTE

The Hapalua Route runs westbound along Ala Moana Boulevard, to Nimitz Highway, right onto Nuuanu Avenue, right onto King Street, right onto Kapiolani Boulevard, right onto Piikoi Street, left onto Ala Moana Boulevard, right onto Kalakaua Avenue, left onto Monsarrat Avenue, right onto Paki Avenue, left onto Diamond Head Road, right onto 18h Avenue, right onto Kilauea Avenue, right onto Waiialae Avenue, to the H-1 Freeway (eastbound), to Kalaniana'ole Highway (all lanes Makai/ocean side), left onto Hawaii Kai Drive, right onto Keahole Street, right turn back to Kalaniana'ole Highway (westbound), left onto Kealaolu Avenue, right onto Kahala Avenue, to Diamond Head Road, left onto Kalakaua Avenue to the Finish Line at Kapiolani Park.





THE FOLLOWING ROADWAYS WILL BE CLOSED OR RESTRICTED ON SUNDAY, APRIL 10, 2022



12:30AM - 8:00AM

Ala Moana Boulevard from Atkinson Drive to Ward Avenue will be detoured from 12:30AM. Ala Moana Boulevard, including access to Ala Moana Park should be re-opened at approximately 8:00AM.

2:30AM

Ala Moana Boulevard/Nimitz Highway Koka Head bound traffic from Nuuanu to Ward Avenue will be detoured left at Smith Street from 2:30AM. Please use Vineyard Boulevard as a detour route.

3:30AM

King Street from Nuuanu Avenue to Kapiolani Boulevard from 3:30AM. Traffic will be detoured at Smith Street.

3:30AM

Kapiolani Boulevard in both directions from King Street to Piikoi Street at 3:30AM. Ewa bound traffic will be detoured mauka bound (toward the mountains) at Piikoi Street.

1:00AM - 3:00AM

Piikoi Street in both directions from Kapiolani Boulevard to Ala Moana Boulevard from 1:00AM. Local Traffic will be permitted to residents in this area until 3:00AM.

3:30AM

Kalakaua Avenue will be detoured left onto Kahio Avenue from 3:30AM.

4:30AM - 9:00 AM

Kalakaua Avenue mauka side (mountain side) between Monsarrat Avenue and Poni Moi Road from 4:30AM until the Marathon is over. The makai (ocean side) lanes will be contra-flowed for two-way traffic at approximately 9:00AM. Limited to resident traffic only; patrons of the Outrigger Canoe Club and Elks Club must enter via Kapahulu Avenue.

1:30AM - 9:00AM

Kapahulu Avenue makai bound will be closed at Kuhoi Avenue at 1:30AM. Local traffic to Kalakaua Avenue - makai will be permitted after 9AM.

4:30AM - 3:00PM

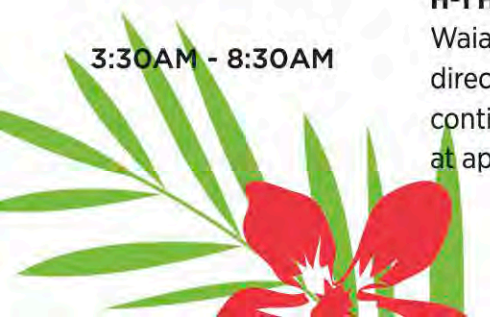
Monsarrat Avenue from Kalakaua Avenue to Paki Avenue from 4:30AM until event over at 3:00PM. Traffic will be limited to tour bus pickups only. No Parking - Tow-Away Zone, both sides of Monsarra Avenue from Kalakaua to Paki Avenue.

4:30AM - 9:00AM

Paki Avenue from Monsarrat Avenue to Kalakaua Avenue from 4:30AM for the duration of the Marathon. Local Traffic Only - access to Diamond Head Tennis Courts from 9:00AM.

3:30AM - 8:30AM

H-1 Highway. Beginning at 3:30AM, all eastbound traffic will be routed off at Waialae Avenue off-ramp/22nd Avenue. H-1 traffic will be partially re-opened directly to the contra-flow lane beginning at approximately 8:30AM, which will continue until the makai lanes of Kalaniana'ole Highway (eastbound) are re-opened at approximately 8:30AM.





3:30AM - 8:30AM

Kalaniana'ole Highway from Ainakoa Street to Hawaii Kai Drive makai side will have restricted access from 3:30AM. The mauka side of the highway will be contra-flowed for two-way traffic, 2 lanes westbound, 1 lane eastbound. West bound Kalaniana'ole Highway traffic will be detoured onto Ainakoa Street to Malia Street to Kilauea Avenue between 5:00AM till approximately 8:30AM.

3:30AM

Kalaniana'ole Highway will be closed to through traffic from Hawaii Kai Drive to Keahole Street from 3:30AM until the area is clear. Traffic will be detoured onto Hawaii Kai Drive via Kawaihae Road to Lunalilo Home Road. Maunaloa Bay boat ramp traffic must enter the Koko Head end.

18th Avenue from Diamond Head Road to Kilauea Avenue until runners clear the area. Traffic will be detoured at Diamond Head Road and Makapuu Avenue. Local Traffic Only access to Diamond Head Crater only will be restricted to Civil Defense, FAA, and National Guard personnel only.

Diamond Head Road, Kahala and Kealaolu Avenues will be controlled by HPD until the volume of runners diminishes to allow the safe movement of vehicles.

11:30AM

Kahala Towers, Kahala Hotel and Resort, and Waialae Country Club traffic will be permitted via Aukai Avenue and Pueo Street when safe, approximately 11:30AM.

5:30AM

Kealaolu Avenue from Walalae Avenue to Kahala Avenue from about 5:30AM until the area is clear. Local Traffic may be permitted - only by direction of the HPD - at Aukai Avenue.

4:00AM - 11:00AM

Kilauea Avenue from 18th Avenue to Waialae Avenue, all eastbound lanes will be closed at 4:00 AM until runners clear the area. Westbound lanes will be contra-flowed to permit two-way traffic. Vehicular traffic exiting the lower Kahala area must cross Kilauea Avenue at Hunakai Street. Expect delays until 11:00AM.

2:30AM

Hawaii Kai Drive makai lanes from Kalaniana'ole Highway to Keahole Street from about 2:30AM until the area is clear. The mauka lanes will be contra-flowed for two-way traffic.

2:30AM

Keahole Street makai bound lanes from about 2:30AM until the area is clear. Traffic will be contra-flowed in the mauka bound lanes for two-way flow. Entrance and exit from the Hawaii Kai Shopping Center, COSTCO, etc. will be permitted.

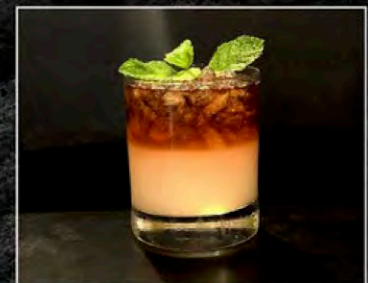

ClimbHI LEI Hospitality Industry Event Celebrates 10th Anniversary at the Hawai'i Convention Center

The Hawai'i Convention Center is welcoming more than 500 intermediate and high school students from across O'ahu for ClimbHI's 10th-annual Leadership, Exploration, Inspiration (LEI) hospitality industry program on April 5, 2022.



LEI is returning for its first in-person event since 2019. More than 1,000 intermediate and high school students participated in last year's statewide virtual LEI event.

Founded in 2009, the Hawai'i-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit ClimbHI seeks to inspire students to finish high school and proceed to post-secondary education or employment by exposing them to future career paths and the steps necessary to achieve those goals. LEI is a Hawai'i Tourism Authority (HTA)-sponsored workforce development project created by ClimbHI to inspire Hawai'i's youth to pursue careers in the state's visitor industry by providing them with the means to achieve success.

During the LEI program, students learn about various aspects of the hospitality industry from participating Hawai'i businesses. This includes career highlights, resident sentiment, the importance of the visitor industry and Hawai'i's cultural values. Students also attend a luncheon led by high-profile speakers, followed by an afternoon career fair.

The O'ahu LEI program at the Center kicks off a series of statewide events, including LEI Maui on April 8; LEI Kauai on April 14 and LEI Island of Hawai'i on April 26 and 27.

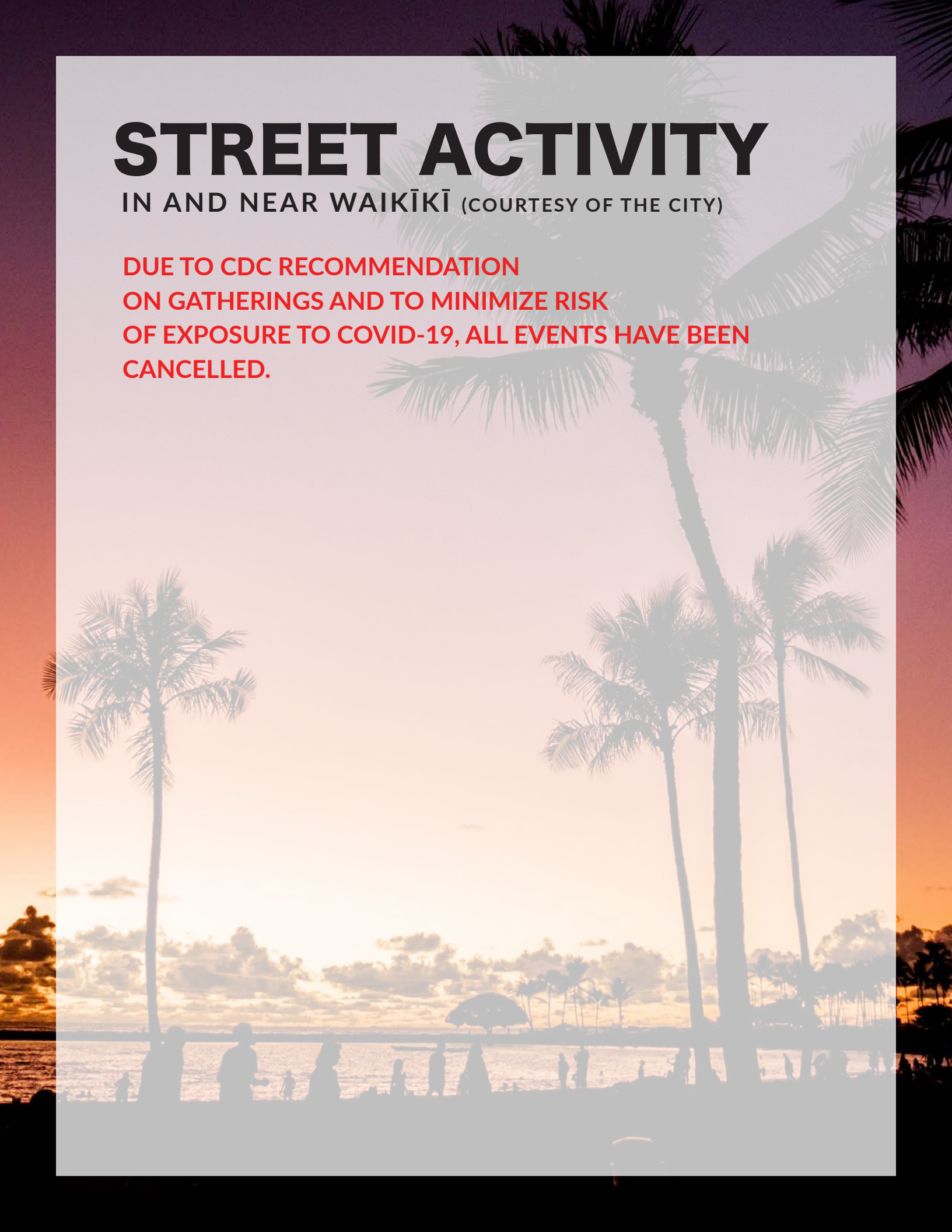
