

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NEW PROPOSED OVERNIGHT BEACH CLOSURES



The Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District Association (WBSIDA) in partnership with the State Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) is working toward a nightly beach closure of the Royal Hawaiian Beach area (between the Royal Hawaiian Groin to the Waikīkī Police station at Kuhio Beach). The beach closure would be from 2am to 5am daily and would be consistent with the City and County of Honolulu beach park closure that is already in effect at Kuhio Beach Park (the adjacent area).

The recent increase in overnight sleeping and personal items being stored on the beach overnight and into the next day has necessitated this change and closes a loophole in the beach park regulations



with people being cleared from Kuhio Beach to simply end up at the Royal Hawaiian Beach. The idea has widespread support from the DLNR and Honolulu Police Department (HPD). The Waikīkī Neighborhood Board unanimously passed a resolution in support of this effort at their February 8, 2022 board meeting.

Proposed Beach Closure Details:

- 1. Royal Hawaiian Beach area closure 2am to 5am daily (from Royal Hawaiian Groin to Kuhio Beach Park, police sub-station).
- 2. No loitering (only will allow transiting through or to ocean)
- 3. DLNR and HPD joint enforcement of new closure hours.
- 4. DLNR has no camping on beach rules already in place.
- 5. Can be temporary (emergency measure until rules are passed).
- 6. The Board of Land and Natural Resources will need to approve the request for beach closure that will be submitted to the Land Board by the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation of the DLNR.
- 7. May require additional rule amendments as a longer-term permanent measure.





Safe Access Oahu Ends



Safe Access Oahu ended on Saturday, March 5th. "This is a day we waited for, for the last two years," said Mayor Rick Blangiardi, "We feel very confident going forward, our numbers look really good for Oahu."

Dylan Ching of TS Restaurants and a director on the board of Hawaii Tourism said, "The Safe Access Oahu program was an important tool to keep our people safe and the economy open. Now we look forward to one step closer to a restriction free Hawaii."



For the first time since March 4, 2020, the City and County of Honolulu will no longer operate under an emergency order regarding COVID-19.

Safe Access Oahu program required businesses —such as restaurants, fitness centers and events that served food — to verify employees and customers were fully vaccinated or had a negative COVID-19 test within the prior 48 hours.

Since the omicron surge over the holidays, case numbers have steadily begun to decrease over the last month. This has led the city to lift its final restrictions.

Duke Kahanamoku's Replica Surfboard from the Waterman Film



Five-time Olympic medalist and Native Hawaiian Duke Paoa Kahanamoku shattered records and brought surfing to the world while overcoming a lifetime of personal challenges.

The 100-pound redwood Duke Kahanamoku surfboard replica shaped by Pohaku Stone and surfed by Duane DeSoto in the *Waterman* film is now on display in the Moana Surfrider lobby.

Waterman is an original documentary by Sidewinder Films, narrated by Jason Momoa, and directed by Isaac Halasima, nephew of Jan Gordon Fisher who sculpted the Duke statue on Waikīkī Beach.

The film explores the journey and legacy of Duke Kahanamoku as a legendary swimmer, trailblazer, and the undisputed father of modern-day surfing. Featuring commentary from surfing's biggest stars, including newly crowned Olympic gold medalist Carissa Moore and the last of the Kahanamoku beach

boys Harry "Didi" Robello, *Waterman* also delves into his personal successes, struggles and humanitarianism through rare footage, contemporary visuals and incisive interviews.

Through Duke's incredible athletic accomplishments, personal doctrine of Aloha, and enduring gift of surfing to the world, *Waterman* explores a theme that still resonates today – the role of sports in breaking societal barriers – and celebrates Duke's triumphs and philosophy of inclusion, challenging us all to embrace diversity and incorporate Aloha into our own lives.






Hawai'i Convention Center Kicks Off 2022 Sports Events

Tying it all together is the artfully aged wood lining the room, which pays homage to the illustrious Japanese whisky barrels that helped the Suntory brand rise to fame as a leading maker of fine spirits.

One of the most notable changes can be seen at the sushi counter, Tokiwa. Tucked away in a private section with its own immersive atmosphere, the redesigned space allows guests to leave the outside world behind and savor an intimate dining moment.

LEND A HAND FOR LEI FOR KAMEHAMEHA III

All kama'āina and malihini are invited to The Royal Grove on Wednesday, March 16 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m., to help sew a 20-foot lei for the Kamehameha III statue lei draping ceremony in honor of his birthday on Thursday, March 17 at 9:00 a.m. at Thomas Square.

A statue of Kamehameha III stands tall at Thomas Square, which was named after British Rear Admiral Richard Thomas. On July 31, 1843, Admiral Thomas ended the British Royal Navy's illegal occupation of Hawai'i by order of Queen Victoria. At a ceremony announcing the close of this chapter in history, Kamehameha III spoke the words that are now known as the motto of Hawai'i: "ua mau ke ea o ka 'āina i ka pono," which roughly translates to "the life of the land is perpetuated in righteousness."
