

Safe and Sound Waikiki Cuts Crime and Amplifies Outreach and Mental Health Services



Honolulu, HI - Safe and Sound Waikiki, a multi-agency collaborative through the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, Waikiki Business Improvement District, City and County of Honolulu, Honolulu Police Department, and Institute for Human Services released it's 18-month update highlighting the shared effort to enhance public safety and security within the Waikiki district while increasing outreach and case coordination efforts for those experiencing homelessness, substance abuse and mental health issues.

"The partnerships strengthened by Safe and Sound Waikiki are making Waikiki a better place for residents to live and tourists to visit. It is holding those who break the law accountable, restricting

chronic trouble makers from the area, and helping people with mental illness and drug addiction find services to transform their lives," said Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney Steve Alm.

Since the program's launch in September 2022, crime has decreased significantly.

- Assault (-12.89%)
- Robbery (-27.58)
- Burglary (-36.91%)
- Auto Theft (-29.49%)
- Property Damage (-29.5%)
- Drug/Liquor Offenses (-44.23%)
- Loitering/Vagrancy (-16.19)

"Statistics for the last 18 months show that crime is down in Waikiki as compared to the 18 months prior to Safe and Sound Waikiki. Working with the program's supporters and prosecutors, we are

making Waikiki safer for residents, visitors and businesses," shares Honolulu Police Chief Arthur J. Logan.

A new partnership with the Waikiki Business Improvement District and the Institute for Human Services allows for a dedicated case coordinator to focus on the Waikiki district to assist those experiencing chronic homelessness, substance abuse and mental health challenges. Since October of 2023:



- 180 individuals have been offered comprehensive outreach and case management support
- 30 individuals have been placed into shelters
- 14 individuals received on-the-spot street medication
- 4 individuals have been placed into stabilization, treatment or respite centers

"As we mark the halfway point of the second year of the Safe and Sound Waikiki initiative, we are immensely proud of the progress we have made, particularly in the sound aspects of our program. While we celebrate these successes, we acknowledge that our journey is far from over. We remain

committed to enhancing the well-being and security of the Waikiki community, and we look forward to continuing our work to ensure Waikiki remains a clean, safe, and welcoming district for residents and visitors alike," said Trevor Abarzua, President & Executive Director, Waikiki Business Improvement District.

"After 18 months of the Safe and Sound Initiative in Waikiki, we have witnessed not just a reduction in crime, but a restoration of peace and prosperity," said Mayor Rick Blangiardi. "Through our collaborative efforts and community vigilance, we believe the tide is turning against disorder, proving that safety is not just a privilege, but a fundamental right we uphold for every resident and visitor. Let this program stand as evidence of our determination to keep our streets safe, and a promise not to let up for those who call Waikiki home."

The success of the Safe and Sound Waikiki initiative would not be possible without continued support from local retailers and the visitor industry.

"By fostering collaboration among private philanthropy, government, and non-profit organizations, we are working together to create a safer and more secure environment for everyone in Waikiki. Our collective efforts are essential in building a community where safety and well-being are paramount. About Safe and Sound Waikiki

The Safe and Sound Waikiki initiative launched on September 6, 2022. However, its roots can be traced back to 1998 when the U.S. Department of Justice introduced the Weed and Seed program to Chinatown/Kalihi-Palama under the direction of then U.S. Attorney Steven Alm. As reported by the Honolulu Star-Advertiser, Weed and Seed "was a hit for residents of the area, who saw crime plummet." Almost a quarter century later, Alm, who is now Honolulu's Prosecuting Attorney, engaged the Honolulu Police Department, the Waikiki Business Improvement District Association, and other stakeholders in bringing the principles of the Weed and Seed program to the hub of Hawai'i's visitor industry under a new name – Safe and Sound Waikiki.

Dear Residents and Businesses,

Road Builders Corporation has been contracted by the City & County of Honolulu to perform the Rehabilitation of Streets, Unit 76A project.

On Thursday, 5/02/24, paving work will start from Olohana St. to Kapahulu Ave. Traffic will be contra flowed during work hours. The project encompasses Kalakaua Ave. from Olohana St. to Kapahulu Ave.; and Kalakaua Ave. from Dillingham Fountain to Poni Moi Rd. (see attached map for reference).

To minimize traffic flow disruptions and to accommodate access, the scheduled work will be done Monday thru Friday between the hours of 8:30 am - 3:30 pm.


Residents and motorists are advised that roadways will be posted with "NO PARKING" signs one 24 hours in advance to warn you of the impending work. Please observe the dates and times of these notices as <u>vehicles</u> <u>parked on posted streets will be towed at the owner's expense.</u> Observe and obey all traffic controls, posted signs and Special Duty Officers. Drivers should anticipate detours, lane, and road closures delays and allow extra travel time while driving through the work areas. Residents and local traffic such as deliveries and trash collection will be allowed during construction.

Every effort will be made to complete this essential work as quickly and with as little inconvenience to your community as possible. The asphalt material is hot, black, and tacky; walking or driving across the pavement in an uncured state could cause serious burns and tracking marks onto driveways/sidewalks. Therefore, for your safety and protection from these hazards, we may delay your entry/exit through the construction area during work hours. Your assistance and cooperation during this project will be greatly appreciated.


