

WAIKĪKĪ BEACH NEWS AND UPDATES - MARCH 2020 Royal Hawaiian Groin Replacement Project Postponed Until Fall of 2020



The Royal Hawaiian Groin located between the Sheraton Waikiki and the Royal Hawaiian hotel, was originally built in 1927 and is planned to be replaced with a new rock structure. The original Spring construction schedule for the new groin has been postponed until the Fall of 2020. A primary concern is the landward portion of the existing groin which holds the existing sand beach in place, is severely undermined, cracked and bowing. Its failure would result in the destabilization and loss of the sandy shoreline located to the east of the groin.

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) in partnership with the Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District Association (WB-SIDA), is planning to replace the existing Royal Hawaiian groin with an engineered rock rubble-mound groin. The primary project objective is to maintain the approximate beach width of the 2012 Waikiki Beach Maintenance shoreline nourishment project. No enlargement of the beach or additional sand is proposed as part of this project.

PROJECT COSTS:

- 1. Estimated costs of \$2,500,000 for construction.
- 2. Cost share of 50% up to \$1,250,000 from the WBSIDA.

EXPECTED START DATE:

Pending final state contracts, we anticipating a construction start date of Fall of 2020.

BEACH MAINTENANCE:

A subsequent follow up beach maintenance project is being planned in the Winter/Spring, of 2021. This is being planned through a public/private partnership with the DLNR and the WBSIDA for up to 12,000 cubic yards of sand pumped in from immediately offshore, similar to the 2012 project. This is roughly half of the volume of sand delivered in the 2012 beach maintenance project.



Christmas Day King Tides

On Christmas day, 2019 we experienced a near all-time record water level at the Honolulu tide gauge (unofficial-pending NOAA verification) with a water level of 3.366 feet above Mean Lower Low Water (MLLW). This was due to a combination of seasonal "King tides," (~2.3ft) a regional episodic water level anomaly (+10 inches) plus a minor Kona storm (+3-4 inches) that all coincided in the early morning hours on December, 25th, 2019. Luckily, the peak of the tide was before dawn and before the heavy rain later than day and did not interfere with normal beach use. The <u>water levels</u> <u>Christmas morning</u> were potentially record setting with what looks like could be (preliminarily) <u>the 2nd highest recorded</u>

water level in the Honolulu Tide gauge history, nearly reaching the 1992 Hurricane Iniki levels by less than 1 inch. The WBSIDSA is constantly monitoring water levels for seasonal and regional outlooks and predictions of unusual water levels. Our next round of seasonal King Tides is expected in the summer months of June-August so stayed tuned for more updates.

26TH ANNUAL HONOLULU FESTIVAL CANCELLED

TO HELP PREVENT THE POTENTIAL TRANSMISSION OF THE CORONAVIRUS IN HAWAII



HONOLULU – The Honolulu Festival Foundation announced that the 26th annual Honolulu Festival, which had performances and events scheduled from Friday, March 6, through Sunday, March 8, has been cancelled to help prevent the potential transmission of the coronavirus in Hawaii.

Foundation officials made the decision to cancel the popular festival in response to

recommendations made by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, State of Hawaii, and Japan's government that precautions be taken to prevent the spread of the coronavirus, including the cancellation or postponement of large gatherings of people.

Hiroyuki "Keith" Kitagawa, president of the Honolulu Festival Foundation, stated, "We apologize for the disappointment our decision to cancel this year's Honolulu Festival causes for anyone who was looking forward to enjoying this annual celebration of cultural performances and the arts."

"There are currently no cases of the coronavirus in Hawaii. However, considering the precautions and recommendations being made by government health officials to prevent the spread of the coronavirus, cancelling this year's Honolulu Festival is the responsible action to help protect the public's safety."



THE ROYAL HAWAIIAN, A LUXURY COLLECTION TO DE-BUT ALL-NEW 'AHA 'ĀINA LŪ'AU

HONOLULU – February 7, 2020 – The highly acclaimed 'Aha 'Āina Lū'au, known for its accurate, authentic depiction of Hawai'i's history and royalty, is being revamped and is set to debut an all-new look at the majestic The Royal Hawaiian, a Luxury Collection Resort in April. 
After the feast, the show




